- Completed NAAC Assessment. Successfully underwent the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) evaluation process. Obtained Grade A with 3.22 CGPA enhancing institutional quality standards.
- Obtained financial support from government agencies and industries for various institutional development initiatives.
- The number of students admitted for UG & PG programs are 520. The curriculum prescribed and designed by affiliating university is followed. College prepares the academic & activity calendar and time table. Teaching plan is prepared by departments. ICT tools enable the students to learn the subject content from a multidimensional perspective. Induction program and bridge courses are conducted for freshers. Guest lectures, expert talks and workshops are arranged for effective learning process.
- Faculty coordinators took review of the TLE process. The compliance of the curriculum is communicated to the Principal through the HODs and performance of the students is verified by examination and feedback. Assignments, seminars and projects are assigned to the students. Mentor-Mentee Scheme works for identifying and addressing various problems of the students. Effective curriculum delivery is accomplished with the help of various e-platforms like Google classroom, video conferencing apps, Whatsapp, YouTube, Google forms, etc.
- Certificate Courses in Vaidic Mathematics, Vyavharic Marathi and Manual Accounting were arranged. Value added/Add-on Courses on Communication Skills, Making of Crafts, Time Management, Yoga & Meditation for good health, Martial Arts for Self-Defense were organized. Celebration of various important days
- Workshops on skill development, safety, and prevention of sexual harassment and cyber security for women were organized.
- Faculties deliver popular science lectures and disseminate study materials through local languages. Local arts and crafts are promoted through entrepreneurship development and industry linkage cell of the college. Tribal culture is focused through various programs. As many as 36 courses have great amount of curricula contents related to Indian Knowledge System. In several programs Indian values, thoughts of saints, Indian thinkers, etc. are discussed in details. Topics on ethno botany integrate use of medicinal plants and their utilization in modern medicine.
- Various cross cutting issues are specially addressed through extension activities, cultural events, NSS, etc.
- 11 teachers are working as member of Board of Studies (BOS) while 03 teachers as member of academic council, 02 teachers as Chairman of BoS and 04 teachers as a Member of Faculty of affiliating University. Teachers actively involved in formulation of curricula for BA, BSc, B.Com, add on/value added and certificate courses, etc. Shared valuable suggestions from students feedback with university
- The scheme of examination prescribed by the affiliating university to conduct the theory and practical examinations is followed. Semester examinations are carried out

by the university. The college examination committee conducts and monitors internal examinations according to academic calendar. The academic calendar is well planned and based on the university calendar and provided to the students through e-mail and whatsapp groups. CIE includes tests, assignments, question-answer sessions, group discussions, quizzes and seminars. Efforts are made to make students aware of the continuous internal evaluation mechanism which includes academic calendar, examination system, nature of question papers and marking scheme. University has prescribed internal tests, assignments, seminars, group discussion, project work, industrial visits, study tours, field visits, etc. for continuous internal evaluation. All the activities related to continuous internal evaluation are conducted as per the given schedule.
